

# **Lesson 56: Talking About Emergency Situations**

## 1. Dialogue

First, repeat after your tutor. Then, practice each role.

Keiko: Hello. I'd like to report an accident. A cyclist has just slammed into the rear of my car.

911 Operator: Can you tell me your name and location, ma'am?

Keiko: I'm Keiko Kawasaki. I'm in the parking lot of Wal-Mart on Maine Street.

911 Operator: Keiko, I have just dispatched the paramedics and they are on their way. Can you tell me exactly how the accident happened?

Keiko: I was getting ready to drive off when something hit the car from behind. I got out and saw a man and his bicycle on the ground.

911 Operator: Can you check if he's breathing?

Keiko: His chest is moving up and down. What's taking the paramedic so long to get here? This man could be dying.

911 Operator: Help will be there in a short while. You have to be calm and stay on the line for me. Can you do that?

Keiko: (breathing deeply) Okay. I can do that.
