

Lesson 57: Asking for Directions

1. Dialogue

First, repeat after your tutor. Then, practice each role.

Yuudai: (on a crowded beach) Excuse me, miss. Can you tell me if there's a pharmacy around here? Penelope, the Lifeguard: There's one just behind the small stores.
