1. Dialogue

First, repeat after your tutor. Then, practice each role.

Chikako: Good morning. I'd like to inquire about sending a parcel to Japan.

Bryan: I'll connect you to the shipping department. Hold on please.

there's a special way of packing the bottles. I strongly recommend that you let us pack the items.

Chikako: In that case, I should bring the stuff to you. What time do you close the shop? Bryan: We're open until 9:00PM.

Chikako: I see. May I know who this is?

Bryan: My name is Bryan. I'll be the first person you'll see when you come by.

Chikako: Thank you for your help, Bryan. I will see you in a while.
