1. Dialogue

Takeshi works for a furniture company as a craftsperson. He is having a meeting with a company executive about some issues at the workshop.

Takeshi: Thank you for meeting with me, Mr. Barton.

Mr. Barton: No problem. How's everything at the workshop?

Takeshi: As you know, there has just been an accident. Ichiro got injured while moving furniture into the delivery truck.

Mr. Barton: I feel very sorry for Ichiro.

Takeshi: Anyway, I've come here to follow up on our request.

Mr. Barton: Ah, yes. You're asking for extra compensation in case of a worker gets injured. Is that right?

Takeshi: That's correct. What have the executives decided on?

Mr. Barton: I'm afraid that we're declining to grant your request. The company already pays for the hospital expenses when an employee gets injured. Besides, the injured employee will receive some insurance money from the government.

Takeshi: Government insurance is not enough to cover our living expenses, Mr. Barton. In Ichiro's case, he can't work for three months. It means he can't receive a salary until he gets well.

Mr. Barton: I understand your opinion, Takeshi. Don't worry. I'll bring this up again at the next meeting.
